Summer Programme		The Summer Programme is an annual engagement of young people in three weeks of work experience during the months of July and August. The objective of this programme is to expose the participants to key employability skills, as well as, developing and refining the characteristics that are important in gaining and retaining meaningful employment.	4,722 participants completed the programme
Graduate Work Experience Programme	EXISTING (prior to FY 14/15)	The Graduate Work Experience Programme is designed to provide valuable work experience to tertiary graduates up to 24 years old. It is a response to the dual challenges of graduates being unable to gain jobs without experience and who cannot gain meaningful experience without jobs. Participant benefit from six (6) months work experience in a practical work environment, supported by a stipend.  This programme provides tertiary graduates possessing a First Degree or an Associate Degree with the opportunity to enhance their personal and professional development through workshops, volunteer service and work experience.  NYS' Graduate Work Experience Programme was piloted in FY 2012/2013.	302 interns engaged
Access to Higher Education Partnership Programme	EXIS	This is a partnership programme between NYS and select Tertiary institutions. At present our partners are the College of Agriculture, Science and Education (CASE), Caribbean Maritime Institution (CMI), Browns Town Community College (BTCC) and the Northern Caribbean University (NCU).  AHEP Programme offers up to \$100,000 tuition assistance to scholars who are studying in national priority areas (Agriculture, Logistics, Engineering, Tourism, Information and Communication Technology). Scholars are required to maintain a GPA of 3.0 and are engaged in empowerment sessions and volunteer service.	92 scholars engaged

Empowerment Programme	The Empowerment programme is a seven (7) month engagement for young persons with mild intellectual disabilities. It consists of a three (3) week non-residential camp followed by six (6) months of supported work experience.	
	The goal of the programme is to improve the personal, professional and social capacity of persons with mild intellectual disabilities, through profiling participants' skills, developing their potential, supporting them with a job coach, and guiding their progression into employment.	104 participants engaged

Enrichment Programme	The Enrichment Programme is a holistic youth development intervention which engages participants with two (2) CSEC subjects or fewer, in personal development activities, volunteerism, mentorship, skills or literacy and numeracy training for a period of up to one (1) year, as deemed necessary.	75 participants engaged
	Elements of this programme were successfully piloted in FY 2013/2014 as our Summer Enrichment Camp Project.	
Entrepreneurship programme	This programme provides youths with the tools and skills needed to assist them in preparing to start a business through extensive business development training and support as well as the opportunity to obtain finances through a competitive forum.  NYS' Entrepreneurship Programme was piloted in FY 2013/2014.	25 persons participated in the parish competition. Of these, 5 were selected to participate at the National level – the top 3 persons received awards, totalling six hundred and fifty thousand dollars (\$650,000.00).
